


# Disruption A29 Heinenoord Tunnel

## Closures in 2024



### Rijkswaterstaat is renovating the Heinenoord Tunnel on the A29.

The Heinenoord Tunnel renovations started in 2023 and will continue until the end of 2024. Rijkswaterstaat constructed a central gallery in 2023. This is an enclosed escape tunnel. The tunnel's technical installations and systems will be replaced in 2024.

The tunnel will be closed at various times to ensure safety during the renovations. Allow for additional journey time on top of the normal journey time.

#### **Road traffic closures Heinenoord Tunnel**

- The tunnel will be closed in both directions from Friday 26 July 10.00 pm to Friday 9 August 5.00 am.
- · Various overnight and weekend closures, often in one direction.

#### **Road traffic diversions**

- Through traffic from/to Rotterdam to/from Bergen op Zoom: via highways A15, A16, A17 or A59 (and vice versa)
- Local traffic to/from Hoeksche Waard: via the motorway N217 and highway A16 (and vice versa)
- Traffic from/to Rotterdam to/from Goeree-Overflakkee via highways A15, A16, A17 en A59 (and vice versa)
- Traffic from/to Rotterdam to/from Zierikzee: via the highway A15 and motorway N57 (and vice versa)
- Local traffic to/from Goeree Overflakkee: via the motorways N215 and N57 or highways A59, A17 and A16 (and vice versa)

Allow for additional journey time. The diversion will be indicated by yellow signs and information signs along and above the road.

#### Cyclists and pedestrians

There will be no inconvenience for cyclists and pedestrians at the Heinenoord Tunnel. They can use the Second Heinenoord Tunnel as they do now. During the Heinenoord Tunnel closure, when the ferries are operating, the Oud-Beijerland - Rhoon, Puttershoek - Zwijndrecht and Nieuw-Beijerland - Hekelingen/Spijkenisse ferries will be free for cyclists and pedestrians.

#### Advice to road users

Rijkswaterstaat will minimise the disruptions. As well as diversions and communications, this includes such measures as adjusting traffic lights to improve traffic flow and campaigns to stimulate cycling and the use of public transport.

You can also take action yourself to to avoid getting stuck in traffic jams:

- Be well prepared before departing
- · Be aware of when roads or waterways are closed and what the diversions are
- Check current traffic jams and diversions before you leave via existing apps, <u>rwsverkeersinfo</u> or <u>vanAnaarBeter</u> or renovatieheinenoordtunnel.nl

And once you are at your destination, please consider:

- Renting an e-bike/bicycle for short distance travel
- Travelling by public transport. You can buy a Tourist Day Ticket, with which you can visit the whole of South Holland as you wish: touristdaytickets.com
